Coin Street and project, Sport for Futures, are runners up in this year's National Lottery People's Projects with a discretionary award of up to £10,000 towards sports and wellbeing activities, making a difference for young people in Lambeth and Southwark.

Coin Street was one of only five organisations to get to the final in the People's Projects for the London region. A team of volunteers made a valiant effort to secure votes, talking to members of the public and spreading the word across SE1 about Sport for Futures.
